Incorporated in 1860, the town of Wake Forest has grown from the original 615 acres purchased by Dr. Calvin Jones in 1805 to nearly 11,000 acres within the city limits.

With almost 40,000 residents—one-third under the age of 18—Wake Forest is Wake County's fourth largest town. Following the overall trend in Wake County, Wake Forest has experienced tremendous growth in recent years while continuing to prioritize and balance historic preservation, downtown revitalization and urban planning and forestry.

Area Recreation: The Heritage Club—private community club offers golf, swimming, tennis and a public clubhouse restaurant.

Non-resident memberships available. Granite Falls Swim & Athletic Club - Family-friendly, progressive year-round fitness and swim club. YMCA at the Factory - Fitness classes and programs for people of all ages. Falls Lake Reservoir—A 12,000-acre recreational lake spans two counties (www.nc.parks.gov) and is Raleigh's primary water source. Just south of the Neuse River the WRAL Soccer Center jut south of the Neuse River and Wake Forest boasts 23 Bermuda grass fields and a 3,000-seat championship stadium. Greenways/parks—Adjacent to Reservoir Park are hiking and biking trails and parks throughout the town and along the Neuse River. The Capital Area Greenway System connects over 100 miles of trails and parks to explore.





Current assignments are Richland Creek Elementary, Wake Forest Middle School and Wake Forest High School. North Raleigh private schools: Thales Academy, Wake Christian Academy and Ravenscroft. Wake Forest Vicinity Map


